## REQUESTING SCIENTIFIC REVIEW OF JACKSON DEMONSTRATIONSTATE FOREST\*

WHEREAS, the science is convincing that ourexistential fight against climate change demands expanded effort tostore carbon in the State's natural and working lands to remove itfrom the atmosphere; and WHEREAS, the Mendocino County Board of Supervisorsembraces the responsibility to mitigate the systemic risks climatechange poses to humans and natural systems; and WHEREAS, on October 7, 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom, through an executive order, committed the State of California toa goal of protecting 30% of California's land and coastal watersby 2030; and WHEREAS, in November, 2021, leaders of more than 100countries, including the United States, held climate talks inGlasgow and President Biden pledged to end deforestation by 2030;and WHEREAS, the Governor's executive order directs theState's Natural Resources Agency to draw up a plan by February1, 2022; and WHEREAS, the County of Mendocino has an integral roleto play in helping the State achieve its 30 by 30 climate goalencouraged by California's Climate Change Scoping Plan for local

governments to adopt to reduce greenhouse gasemissions by 15% below 1990's levels by 2020, 40% below 1990's levelsby 2030 and 80% below 1990's levels by 2050; and WHEREAS, the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection has adopted commercial Timber Harvest Plansfor Jackson Demonstration State Forest based on goals notyet refreshed to reflect the State's recent climatecommitments and has commenced logging; and WHEREAS, science-based forest management is vital tobolstering long term forest health, improving forest resiliencyfrom wildfire, protecting wildlife habitat and ripariancorridors; and WHEREAS, the County of Mendocino respects the guidanceof Mendocino's indigenous people, many of whom arecalling to prioritize carbon sequestration and in-forest storage, preservation and protection of Native Americancultural heritage, equitable access to public lands, and theprotection of California's rare and endangered species; and WHEREAS the State of California should ensure there is no inconsistency between Jackson Demonstration StateForest management goals and the adopted State of Californiaclimate change commitments. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Mendocino CountyBoard of Supervisors urges Governor Newsom and the State'sNatural Resources Agency to include any climate impacts of commercial logging on State lands in drawing up the plan toprotect 30% of California's land use and coastal waters by 2030, andto publish

a science-based report that evaluates carbonsequestration capacity and wildfire resiliency of current management

practices, as well as alternate management scenarios, of Jackson

Demonstration State Forest; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Mendocino County Board of Supervisors strongly urges Governor Newsom to alignJackson Demonstration State Forest management goals with the adopted State of California climate changecommitments, and to do so in a way that enhances thewide-ranging scientific, recreational and economicopportunities offered by Jackson Demonstration StateForest.
