**Summary of Request:**

Redwood Community Crisis Center (RC3) provides emergency mental health crisis intervention services to the children, youth and young adults in Mendocino County who are experiencing crisis episodes and are in need of immediate support. Services include mental health assessments, psychiatric referrals and follow-up,

connection to resources and long-term support, inpatient psychiatric referrals, and Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) and Community Services and Supports (CSS) funding. Funding for this Agreement is provided by a federal Mental Health Block Grant (MHBG) for Fiscal Year 2016-17.
