In the United States, a benefit corporation (B-Corporation) is a type of for-profit corporate entity, authorized by 30 U.S. states and the District of Columbia

Benefit corporations differ from traditional C corporations in purpose, accountability, and transparency, but not in taxation. In California B-Corporations were approved with the passage of Assembly Bill No. 361 on October 9, 2011.
