Agenda Title:

Adoption of Resolution Declaring the Continuation of a Local Emergency Related To the Redwood Complex Fire

Recommended Action/Motion:

Adopt Resolution declaring the continuation of a Local Emergency related to the Redwood Complex Fire; and authorize Chair to sign same.

Previous Board/Board Committee Actions:

On October 10, 2017, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 17-147, declaring an emergency related to the Redwood Complex Fire. On October 31, 2017, November 14, 2017, and November 21, 2017, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution Nos. 17-153, 17-164, 17-174, 17-176, 17-194, 18-004 and 18-016, and 18-027 respectively, declaring continuations of the local emergency.

Summary of Request:

On October 9, 2017, the Redwood Fire started and has resulted in significant structural damage to several portions of the County. On October 9, 2017, the Mendocino County Chief Executive Officer/Director of Emergency services proclaimed, by delegation, that a state of emergency exists. On October 10, 2017, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution 17-147, declaring an emergency related to the Redwood Complex Fire. On October 31, 2017, November 14, 2017, November 21, 2017, December 5, 2017, and December 19, 2017,

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the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution Nos. 17-153, 17-164, 17-174, 17-176, 17-194, 18-004 and 18-016, 18 -027 respectively, declaring continuations of the Local Emergency.

As of 3/19/2018, the preliminary hazardous waste sweeps have been completed for all 337 properties. 321 properties have arranged for cleanup through the public Consolidated Debris Removal Program, and debris has been removed from 306 parcels, of which 81 are still awaiting final soil testing results.

Pursuant to MCC Section 7.04.090(3), the Board of Supervisors shall review, at its regularly scheduled meetings until the local emergency is terminated, the need for continuing the local emergency. However in no event shall a review take place more than thirty (30) days after the previous review. It is proposed that at its meeting on February 6, 2018, the Board of Supervisors adopt a Resolution declaring the continuation of the local emergency.
