Approval of Amendment to BOS Agreement No. 16-011, In the Amount of \$26,875, for a New Agreement Total of \$349,375, and Extending the Termination Date from June 30, 2019, to September 30, 2019, to Provide Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Administration in Mendocino County, Effective When Agreement Becomes Fully Executed Through September 30, 2019

<u>Recommended Action/Motion:</u>

Approve amendment to BOS Agreement No. 16-011, in the amount of \$26,875, for a new Agreement total of \$349,375, and extending the termination date from June 30, 2019, to September 30, 2019, to provide Emergency Medical Services (EMS) administration in Mendocino County, effective when Agreement becomes fully executed through September 30, 2019; and authorize Chair to sign same.

October 16, 2018, Item 5(i), presentation regarding Local Emergency Services Agency models;

March 12, 2019, Item 6(a), exploration of transitioning the Local Emergency Medical Services Agency partnership with Sonoma County to a Joint Powers Authority;

May 14, 2019, Item 4(d), approval of Emergency Medical Care Committee by-laws.

Summary of Request:

Pursuant to Health and Safety Code 1797.200, each county may designate an Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency to oversee pre-hospital care within its jurisdiction. Since January 1994, Mendocino County has contracted with Sonoma County to provide EMS Agency Administration. Services include, but are not limited to:

- Planning, implementing, and evaluating designated components of the EMS system
- Contracting with or employing a physician to serve as the EMS Medical Director
- Establishing policies and procedures ensure medical control of the EMS system
- Approving and monitoring training programs related to EMS personnel
- Evaluating any alleged violations and taking corrective actions where necessary
- Approving alternate base stations to provide medical direction to advanced life support personnel

Over the past two years, the Board of Supervisors, the Executive Office, and the Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) have explored options to refine and improve the County's EMS systems. This process included issuance of a Request for Proposal to establish an Exclusive Operating Area for providers of emergency ambulance services (which is overseen by the EMS agency), exploration of other EMS Agency models (including transitioning the partnership with Sonoma County to a regional Joint Powers Authority), and further negotiation with Sonoma County. The proposed amendment supports Mendocino County's continued relationship with Sonoma County for administration of EMS services.

Due to the complexity and breadth of EMS-related issues, and the need for additional negotiations with Sonoma County, HHSA requests that the Board of Supervisors approve the proposed amendment.
