Approval of Submission for Grant Application for Funds Available through California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) in the Amount of \$300,000 to Provide Public Awareness and Community Education to Combat Drug Impaired Driving and Improve Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety for the period of November 1, 2018 through October 31, 2019; Authorization for Health and Human Services Agency Director or Designee to Sign Agreement if Funding is Granted and any Renewals or Amendments that do not Exceed the Annual Maximum Amount; and Direction for the Auditor Controller to Create Budget Information and Allow HHSA Director to Implement Spending

Recommended Action/Motion:

Approve submission of grant application for funds available through California OTS in the amount of \$300,000 to provide public awareness and community education to combat drug impaired driving and improve pedestrian and bicycle safety for the period of November 1, 2018 through October 31, 2019; authorize the HHSA Director or designee to sign Agreement if funds are granted and any renewals or amendments that do not exceed the annual maximum amount; and direct the Auditor Controller to create budget information and allow HHSA director to implement spending.

Summary of Request:

The OTS mission is to effectively and efficiently administer traffic safety grants while fostering partnerships to deliver innovative programs that reduce traffic deaths, injuries and economic losses. If funds are received Mendocino County Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA), Public Health Branch will provide services through the Prevention of Drug Impaired Driving Program and will partner with community organizations to meet grant deliverables. Public Health's Prevention and Planning Unit and subcontractors will work with youth, children and the general public to create awareness and educational strategies to prevent drug impaired driving and improve bicycle safety.
