Title IV-E Training Funding Background

- Same federal funding source as Foster Kinship Care Education, Social Work (Bachelor's and Master's Degree) Stipends, Regional Training Academies, etc.
- CLPCCD's model is different and based on a model developed in 2000 in Ventura County.
 - Not administered through the state
 - Contract directly with counties and therefore use the county's federal rate (or proration rate) not state rate
- Currently CLPCCD has contracts in Alameda, Amador, Calaveras, Humboldt, Lake, Mendocino, Solano, Tehama, and Tuolumne.
 - Monterey, Ventura, and San Francisco use different colleges





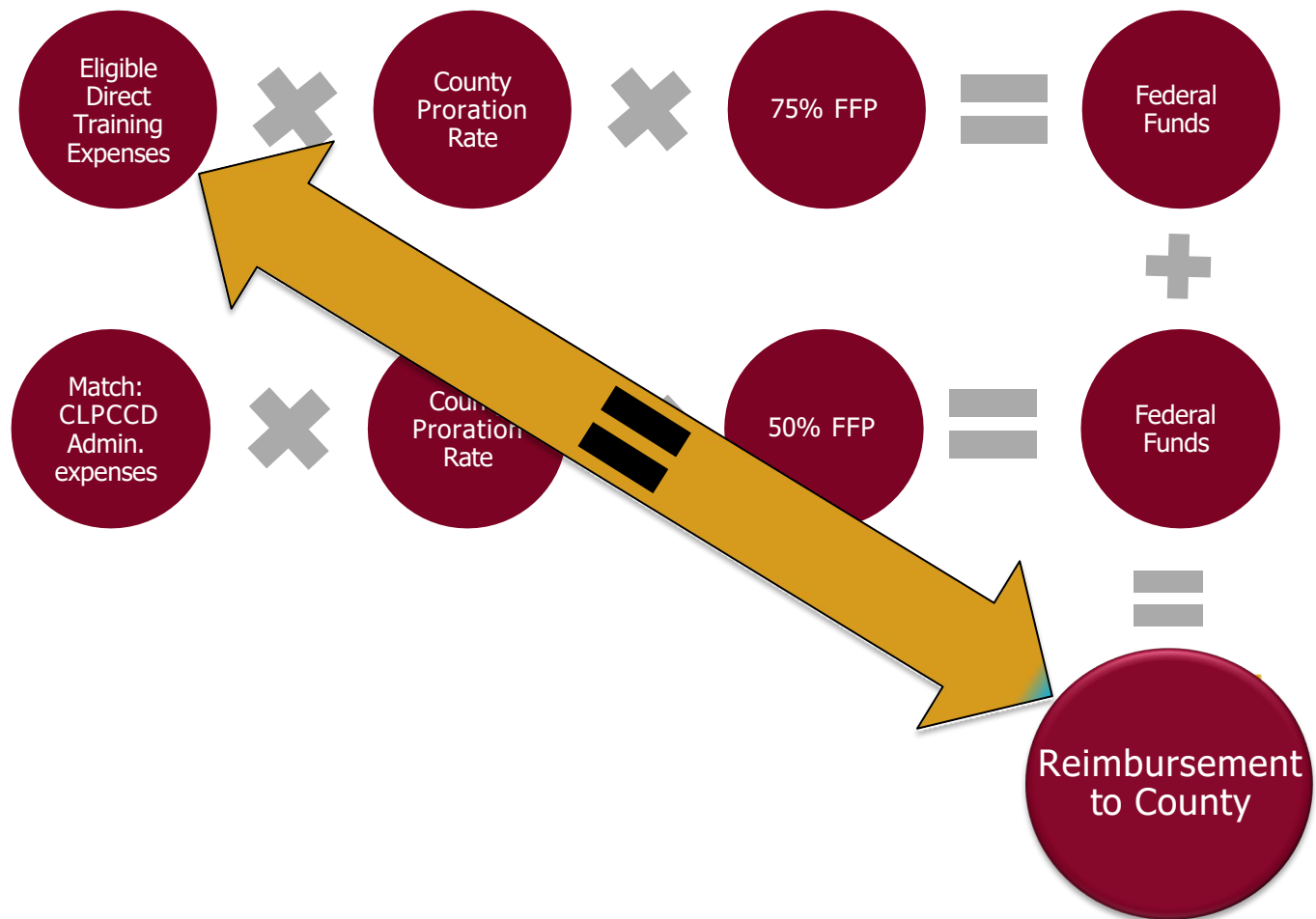
Title IV-E Training Requires Cost Sharing

- The Federal Financial Participation (FFP):
 - 75% for most direct training expenses
 - 50% for administrative expenses
- Prorated based on the proportion of federally eligible kids in care in the county (by quarter)
$$\frac{\text{\# of federally eligible kids}}{\text{\# of total kids in care}}$$
- Federal regulations allow educational institutions to provide “match”

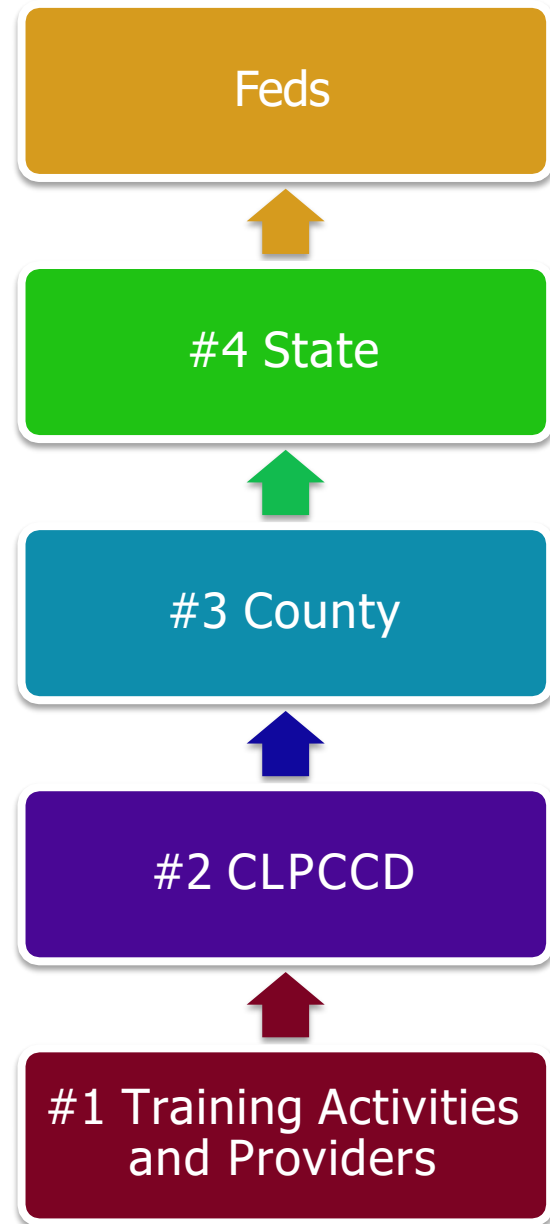


How the reimbursement works

CLPCCD provides the “match”- the district’s non-federal/ unmatched administrative expenses required to make sure the county gets back full reimbursement for eligible training expenses.

Mendocino County Highlights from FY 2024/2025

- Training Collaborative provided 3,129 hours of training to 5,856 participants.
- Topics included: Professional Assault Crisis Training, Supporting LGBTQ and Native American Youth in foster care, Trauma and Resilience, Positive Parenting Program, Substance Use Harm Reduction and Suicide Prevention, among many others
- Being part of CLPCCD training group expands training opportunities for eligible participants to attend trainings offered by other counties who contract with CLPCCD
