1. What are the top 3 Priorities for your Supervisorial District?

- **Completing a smooth and transparent annexation and service coordination process (1)**

My priority is to continue moving annexation discussions forward in a way that is clear, collaborative, and fiscally responsible. This includes clear data on the tax-sharing and service agreements, improving public understanding of annexation impacts, and ensuring that surrounding communities such as Potter Valley and Redwood Valley are supported as city boundaries and service areas evolve.

- **Housing production tied to economic stability (3)**

Housing remains a top district priority, with an emphasis on moving approved projects into construction. This includes market-rate housing, affordable and senior housing, tribal housing, and supportive and sober living. Projects such as Bella Vista, Vineyard Crossings, the Pinoleville housing project, the Intertribal Village on Cooper Lane, and the now-completed Ukiah Recovery Center sober living are critical to stabilizing our workforce and community.

- **Community wellness and public safety through prevention and care (2)**

Community wellness continues to be a district priority, with a focus on behavioral health, substance misuse recovery, homelessness response, and safety. This includes maintaining effective crisis co-response, expanding access to treatment and recovery services, improving trash and encampment cleanup coordination, and reducing recidivism through better behavioral health and reentry support.

A. What are the top three priorities for your Supervisorial District?

B. What are your top three priorities for Mendocino County?

1. Housing and economic development across the county

Attachment A

Countywide, my top priority is increasing housing supply while supporting economic development. This includes reducing barriers in the permitting process, supporting ADUs, mobile home parks, apartment developments, and tribal housing, and advancing projects from entitlement to construction. Economic development efforts should continue to focus on agriculture, cannabis, recreation tourism, broadband expansion, and remote work opportunities, particularly in rural areas.

2. Strengthening the continuum of care for mental health, homelessness, and substance misuse.

Mendocino County has made meaningful progress in behavioral health infrastructure, homelessness response, and substance misuse prevention. The next step is improving outcomes. Priorities include updating the Homeless Strategic Plan, strengthening coordination through HMIS, expanding recovery and post-treatment supports, addressing jail recidivism, and ensuring consistent trash and encampment cleanup strategies that balance public health, dignity, and accountability.

3. Sustainable infrastructure and public safety funding

The County must pursue long-term, sustainable funding solutions for public safety, roads and fire services. Temporary measures are not sufficient. In addition, continued investment in outdoor recreation infrastructure such as Lake Mendocino access, the Russian River, and the Great Redwood Trail supports public health, tourism, and quality of life. Improving active transportation safety and maintaining critical infrastructure remain essential countywide priorities.
